Club Receives WI DNR Approval for Heated 5-Stand Building Project

We are excited to share that the Club has received formal approval from the WI DNR to proceed with the construction of a heated 5-Stand building with exterior lighting. It's great to have the confidence of the DNR in our mission, project and the positive impact the facility will have in terms of expanded shooting opportunities for the community.

One of the things are appreciative of is the DNR's commitment to cost-sharing. Under the terms of this agreement, the DNR will cover 75% of the eligible project costs, up to a maximum of \$100,000.
